THE EVENT

The event seeks to promote research on sustainable fashion and a just transition in the textile industry and to ensure the rights holder's perspective in a just transition.

OUR GUESTS

Fair Action has invited Khalid Mahmood from The Labour Education Foundation (Pakistan) and David Hachfeld from Public Eye (Switzerland) to participate on this event.

Pakistan is a major supplier of textile materials to Sweden's fashion industry. The textile industry, especially fast fashion, is growing rapidly but has significant problems: pollution, overproduction, poor working conditions, and lack of transparency. The problem is therefore multifaceted and needs to be analyzed and tackled on multiple fronts. Sweden is a leader in sustainable fashion research but needs to pay more attention to social issues.

JUST TRANSITION

The concept of Just Transition proposes that changes in the economic model should be made with the interests and well-being of countries, but especially workers and local communities, in mind. However, little is focusing on concrete measures to target, monitor and follow up a just transition.

PUBLIC EYE

Public Eye are currently researching and developing transformation targets for a just fashion industry within planetary boundaries. Their research will be published in December 2024.
